# Town, County agree with CMRB removal

Wheatland County council along with the Town of Strathmore council have both officially signed off on a letter to Municipal Affairs Minister Rick McIver regarding their secession from the Calgary Municipal Region Board (CMRB).

Both signings occurred during the most recent regular council meetings, which also included discussions regarding what comes next for both municipalities.

"With the minister's decision to remove us from the CMRB at the end of March, the mayor (Fule) and I met with (Reeve Link) and the CAO from Wheatland (County) to discuss what the next steps look like," said Town of Strathmore CAO Kevin Scoble. "This is being proactive in addressing the next steps. When we were removed from the CMRB, we are now obligated to do an intermunicipal development plan (IDP) and intermunicipal collaboration framework (ICF) under the Municipal Government Act (MGA) with Wheatland County."

The MGA states that any municipalities not members of a growth board must enter into an IDP and ICF.

The letter to Minister McIver proposes that both Wheatland County and the Town of Strathmore be allowed to begin the process in 2023, which would allow the respective municipalities to adequately budget for the expense to complete the required documents.

The 2023 timeline was reportedly a mutually agreed upon start date by both municipalities with proper budgeting for the process in mind.

The letter also thanks the minister for his involvement in releasing the Town and the County from the board.

"This is more a mutual commitment to the minister showing that we are both willing to collaborate on this in the future and to give him some idea (of timeline,)" said Wheatland County Reeve Amber Link. "(McIver) had indicated at the CMRB meeting where he announced our removal, that we would be required to do these documents ... he had indicated his preference if we could come to some sort of mutual agreement on what might be a reasonable timeline."

McIver could overrule the suggestion in the letter and give a different timeline that he would establish, but according to Link, would prefer to let municipalities establish something collaboratively themselves.

Contact Us Today! 403.934.5589 info@strathmoretimes.com www.StrathmoreTimes.com In neither council meeting was it discussed how much it would cost either municipality to establish and IDP and ICF agreement, nor was a further timeline suggested other than mention of approximately when the process would begin.

In both council meetings, the motion to sign the letter to Minister McIver was passed unopposed. The Town of Strathmore restocked Kinsmen Lake with over 1,700 trout on April 21 in an effort to bring more biodiversity to the lake. Fishing on the lake for the trout will be allowed for catch and release activities. Fishermen aged 16 and younger and also 65 and older can fish on Kinsmen Lake for free, however, those aged 17 to 64-years-old will need to purchase an Alberta Sportfishing License to utilize fishing on the lake. Additionally, if you catch a Prussian Carp, it is important to destroy and property dispose of the fish as they are an invasive species. **John Watson Photo**

# **Town considers options** for increasing and retaining local post-secondary options

The Town of Strathmore is considering its options to attract and retain a post-secondary education presence within the local region.

Geoff Person with Town of Strathmore Communications, presented to Town council on April 20 about the subject after following up on a motion made by Councillor Brent Wiley in February, talking about the different tactics that smaller communities can take to attract and retain post-secondary campuses in their communities.

"What we did is we took a really deep dive into Alberta 2030 - the province's 10-year plan for post secondaries a couple years ago. We also went in and looked at all the different institutions around the province and what they've done around expanding, or reducing their number of satellites," said Person. "There is no definitive list of the tactics that a community can take to attract a campus, especially right now. Timing is a really big piece of this and unfortunately, right now, we're in a period where there isn't a lot of investment in post secondaries expanding their brick-and-mortar campuses."

Person identified to council that over the past three years, more post-secondary campuses in Alberta have declined or closed as opposed to experiencing expansion.

Based on Alberta 2030 and the new financial performance-based metrics that Alberta Advanced Education is fol-

lowing, Person said one of the primary goals is reducing the per-student cost of administration for post-secondary institutions.

"Alberta has one of the highest perstudent costs and a big factor in that is that Alberta also has the lowest postsecondary engagement in the country," said Person who proposed two recommendations for council's consideration in order to begin the process of establishing a plan for appealing to post-secondary institutions regarding a potential local satellite campus.

The first plan being to work with local school boards to find out what Grade 11 and 12 students want, what institutions and programs they are interested in, what a local option would do in terms of their preferences for enrolling locally.

The second is to carry on working with the Strathmore Municipal Library in order to evaluate the interests of potential adult students.

"We think that by doing some of the work with the library to really promote that hub, the news will also come back with some solid metrics around what potential enrollment would be for adult post-secondary (students) in Strathmore," said Person. "In essence, what this would give us is a bit of a roadmap towards which institutions would provide the best bang for our buck in investing in Strathmore."

Council motioned to direct administration to investigate a partnership with Golden Hills School Division #75 and Christ the Redeemer School Division to determine local demand for post-secondary education, directed administration to continue working with the Strathmore Municipal Library and to develop an advocacy plan for post-secondary in alignment with local demand research and report back to council no later than Oct. 5. The motion was carried unopposed.



The letter accuses Ikert of recent actions falling below the standard of conduct and deserving of sanction.

The accusation details a failure to maintain confidentiality with respect to board operations and behaving in such a fashion which has apparently been deemed damaging to the WHMB board.

Within the letter, it is suggested that Ikert spoke to media personnel in December 2021, disclosing the board's deliberations regarding a mandatory vaccination policy for all board members and was apparently quoted as making negative comments about the policy, as well as about the board.


The letter cites Ikert as having been quoted in an article published by the Strathmore Times on Dec. 17, 2021, exhibiting such behaviour. However, upon a search by the Strath*more Times* into their archives, no such article exists matching that given date.

Outlined in the Code of Conduct and Ethics for the board, the chairperson, being Councillor Glenn Koester, is the board's official spokesperson responsible for media inquiries.

Koester said the WHMB has chosen not to comment regarding the letter of reprimand, citing that it was a personal issue to be taken up with Ikert and the letter is his personal property.

Ikert did not respond to a request for information or clarification prior to publication.

"Your overall conduct has fallen well short of the standards expected of a Board member and has been damaging to the Board's operations," which is written in the letter. "You have

Broadcasting services on church Facebook page. www.bowriveralliance.com publicly made derisive remarks about the Board to the media and at Wheatland County Council meetings, which are clearly intended to paint the Board in a negative light."

The letter also cites an email apparently released to the entire board on Jan. 10, 2022 containing inflammatory statements deemed insulting and accusatory toward Wheatland Lodge staff.

Finally, Ikert is accused of releasing that the CAO of the WHMB had contracted COVID-19 despite being double vaccinated and receiving a booster vaccine.

The letter regards the comment as inappropriate to have disclosed such information and suggests the comments were made with the intention of "denigrating" the policies of the board.

As a condition of his continued service on the board, Ikert has been requested to issue a formal letter of apology to Wheatland Lodge staff for his comments, as well as to the CAO for publicly disclosing her personal medical information.


The letter concludes that further violations of board policies and conduct failing to meet behavioural standards will result in additional disciplinary actions up to and including removal from the board.

## Arrests made after attempted use of stolen credit cards STRATHMORE RCMP

On April 21 at 11:57 a.m., a local business reported two individuals left after they attempted to use several credit cards which were declined. Strathmore RCMP members located the individuals in the parking lot getting into a vehicle. A traffic stop was initiated and the occupants were detained in relation to the misuse of credit cards. A search of the vehicle yielded several credit cards and identification not belonging to the three occupants of the vehicle.

As a result, a 29-year-old Calgary woman was released with a court date to face charges in relation to this matter. A 44-year-old Calgary man was taken into custody after being found to be wanted on 15 outstanding warrants from Calgary. The remaining occupant, a 34-year-old Calgary man was issued three traffic violations including operating a vehicle without valid insurance. The vehicle was towed from the site. This matter remains under investigation, further charges may be laid as a result.

"Thanks to the quick reporting by the store employee, Strathmore members were able to locate and apprehend those involved to prevent further offences," said Staff Sergeant Mark Wielgosz, Detachment Commander of the Strathmore RCMP.

With the official premier of Under the Banner of Heaven around the corner, Strathmore's Sophia Fabris (10) shared her experience working on set of the upcoming series.

"It's kind of fun and exciting for the parents too. We get to know lots about the other parents of the kids," added Fabris.



Smart farming can make raising livestock more accurate and controlled. While farm automation is a broad term. precision smart farming zeroes in on exact measurements between variations in land conditions and livestock, according to Techie Loops, a technology information website. Examples of farming automation technology include:

- · autonomous vehicles and machines
- · drones
- $\cdot$  robotics
- · GPS guidance

· micro-forecasting and weather forecasting

- · soil sampling
- yield mapping
- · use of artificial intelligence

· geomatics


· statistical processes, and more.

Farmers can employ these technologies to save time and also manage labor shortages. Robot-assisted irrigation systems, for example, can maximize efficiency of water distribution where it is needed the most. Modern young people are growing up with technology all around them, but few may be aware of the vital role technology plays in the agricultural sector. Young people's ears may perk up upon hearing terms like "robotics" technologies are now a big part of life on the farm. Recognition of that may compel more young people to pursue careers in agriculture.

Young people looking for rewarding careers in an exciting, ever-evolving field can be encouraged to consider the agricultural sector.





# **Complaint against councillor kept confidential**

Wheatland County Councillor Glenn Koester continues to debate with his fellow councillors about how details regarding a formal complaint filed against him should be made public.

During the April 5 regular council meeting, Koester gave council notice that he would present a formal motion regarding the matter at the April 19 regular council meeting.

A previous motion from March 1 moved that council direct administration to hire an independent investigation team for the official complaint filed against Koester.

The complaint was in camera, therefore making it impossible for ratepayers to inform themselves of the issues of the complaint, however, Koester's name regarding the complaint was made public.

As per the Municipal Government Act (MGA), councillors are forbidden from publicly discussing matters that are brought forward in camera. Issues discussed in camera are confidential until otherwise formally released.

Koester moved that council bring the official complaint against him out of camera, thereby fulfilling council's pledge to be more transparent and divulge the full details of the complaint and all relevant accusations.

"I'd like to thank everyone who showed up here today. I'd like to thank the people of Wheatland County for your trust in me, for your phone calls, for your letters, for your visits and for showing up here today, even though no one knows what is hidden from (their) eyes and from the public and what is in camera," said Koester who included some of the letters he received in support of his motion in the agenda package for council's consideration, which were read allowed in council.

"I'm quite aware of the bylaw, but it's been contravened by releasing my name. I think those are circumstances that warrant the total release of ... what I requested," said Koester. "My name (is being defamed) and I can't defend it. I've got people here who trust me. I'm sure there are people wondering and then there are people on the other side who totally believe it."

Koester has also been removed from all committees he was appointed to.

During the debate, Councillor Scott Klassen reminded council of their duty to uphold their own bylaws.

"We are bound by bylaw ... it lays out the whole process, we are very diligent ... to follow this bylaw because it is sensitive in nature. I do understand the public will have questions, but these things are very much similar to an HR issue and we treat it as such," said Klassen. duct complaints public and how such action may diminish ratepayers' confidence in council to keep complaints discreet and private.

"I have concerns that by making a code of conduct complaint public, it would permit the complainant to discuss the complaint publicly as well, which could open up a whole can of worms that could bring further embarrassment to the County and further challenges," said Link.

Council defeated a motion to release to the public information regarding the code of conduct complaint 4-3.

Ratepayer Sharon Skibsted spoke out against council's decision, lik-

ening it to the behaviour of entitled teenagers.

"What if it was your name that was released to the public? How would you feel? Your name, your division asking you and you being handcuffed and not being able to (answer)," said Skibsted. "Shame on you ... what if it was your name, your family, your children coming home to you and saying 'why is my dad, my mom being removed from this council?' I'm embarrassed by your actions today. Who do you think you are?"

Council also defeated a motion to make the findings at the conclusion of the investigation public, 4-3.

If you suffer from seasonal allergies, oral antihistamines can bring relief. If you aren't getting enough relief from these, there are certain nasal sprays, available on prescription and off that can do a great job of relieving symptoms. Check with your doctor or pharmacist and avoid seasonal allergy suffering.

Need help for hemorrhoids? Avoid straining on the toilet (this makes them worse); clean rectal area gently and well; don't scratch (if itchy, use witch-hazel (Tucks) or low dose hydrocortisone creams). Control constipation with high fibre foods like dried apricots. If you need advice, our pharmacists can help. Who should NOT smoke? Everybody, of course, but especially women over 40 on birth control pills (increases risk of stroke and heart disease); pregnant women (increases risk of miscarriage); anyone with children (second-hand smoke increases risk of respiratory and ear infections, asthma and allergies); people with diabetes or hypertension (greatly increases risk of heart disease).

Council debated amending the code of conduct bylaw in order to disclose information regarding complaints and investigations if future cases arise.

That complaint was kept confidential as per the bylaw. Both councillors and the complainant were restricted from sharing details about the complaint publicly.




