## Providing opportunities for rural nurses

Wheatland County council will soon discuss the potential to provide funding to assist a Grow Your Own Rural Nursing Program and Simulation Lab in Drumheller.

During a meeting of the Public Presentation Committee, Aug. 19, representatives from the Drumheller Area Health Foundation (DAHF) presented before the county to discuss the program.

“In March of this year, AHS approached the [DAHF] board with an exciting program aimed at addressing critical nursing shortages in rural Alberta ... it is a rural nursing program and it will require a simulation lab to be built to work in tandem with this program,” said Ashley Berlando, speaking on behalf of the DAHF. “It is a partnership between Alberta Health Services (AHS) and the University of Calgary. It will allow rural residents within 100 km of the Drumheller area to receive their Bachelor of Science and Nursing at the Drumheller Health Center, and a lot of it will be done online.”

She added much of the second year of instruction through the program will take place in person at the Drumheller Hospital – thus, the requirement for the construction of the simulation lab.

Students will be intended to utilize the simulation lab to combine their online learning with in-person labs. Infrequently, students will also be required to travel to the University of Calgary campus for labs.

The course can be condensed from a traditional four-year program into a just over three-year run in order to help reduce financial burdens on students and their families.

“There are two [Grow Your Own] programs in the Central Zone and we will be the third one to roll out. They have cohorts of eight to nine students per term,” said Berlando.

# Kings celebrate reconstruction of team locker rooms

The Agra Risk Wheatland Kings hosted an open house, Aug. 20, for friends and family of the team, showcasing their newly reconstructed locker rooms.

Cody Holdaway, general manager of the Agra Risk Wheatland Kings, said the completion of this project has been several years in the making.

“My first season with the team, so about three years ago now, with the previous general manager, we started a fundraising effort to start selling off stalls in our locker room to fund the renovation efforts,” he said. “In the beginning, it did not go as fast as we would have liked, so it took a couple of seasons but in the end, we were able to raise the capital and build something that is going to last the organization years.”

The Kings will not be disclosing the exact finances which were required to complete the renovation of the locker room.

Holdaway proudly proclaimed the new facilities are now among some of the best in Canadian Junior B hockey. Among the aims of the project were to elevate the culture of the local team.

“Our family now has a home, as the players have been telling me. It is something for the players to be proud of.

They are now twice as excited to come to the rink because they have such a nice room and facility, and it is going to do a lot with recruiting new players,” he said. “You can stay home and play Junior B hockey in Strathmore and get the Junior A experience. It is just as good.”

Holdaway said the impact on the culture of the team has been immediately visible following the project’s completion.

Many of the players could immediately be found utilizing the space despite having no immediate obligation to be there prior to the start of the season.

“The locker room got completely overhauled. Everything that was in there was out, we repainted, we did everything, and then the primary feature was to do the locker stalls. We have fully custom locker stalls that were built to the shape of the room, very similar to what you would see in an NHL or pro level experience,” said Holdaway. “[The players] have something to be proud of. Morale is definitely already

up. They always say, ‘look good, play good,’ and now we look our best, so it is time to prove it.”

The project was unveiled at the Kings’ year end banquet at the conclusion of the previous season. Reconstruction of the space took approximately two months from start to finish.

5. The purchaser of the property will be responsible for property taxes and utilities for the current year. There will be no adjustment to the date of sale.
6. The purchaser will be required to execute a sale agreement in form and substance provided by the municipality.

# Cyanobacteria advisory in place over Eagle Lake

Residents in the vicinity of Eagle Lake are advised to avoid contact with the body of water, as a cyanobacteria advisory has been issued.

David Klassen, medical officer of health for the Calgary zone under the ministry of preventative health services, explained cyanobacteria, also known as blue-green algae, can produce toxins that can have negative health impacts both on humans and domestic animals.

"It is not actually an algae, [though] it acts similar to algae, kind of looks similar, and it also photosynthesizes, but it is actually a bacteria," he said. "You can be exposed in different ways, but most commonly, people can be exposed through the skin, and then you can get some irritated symptoms."

He added you can also be exposed by inhaling the toxin if it is aerosolized such as if someone is jet-skiing, or symptoms may develop if toxins are ingested.

Adverse effects may include headache, fever, muscle and joint pains, diarrhea, abdominal cramps, pain, nausea, or vomiting.

Other noteworthy symptoms, although in more rare cases, cyanobacteria exposure may impact breathing, paralysis, or liver damage. These are considered to be very unlikely.

The most vulnerable to experience symptoms are children who are significantly exposed such as diving with their full bodies or drinking contaminated water, or pets and animals.

"The growth of blooms is impacted by a few different factors. Those include increased nutrients or high levels of nutrients such as phosphorus

in a body of water, plus the warmth of the water. Warmer temperature helps it grow. Sunlight helps with photosynthesis," said Klassen. "If there is not a ton of movement in the body of water, that can also help the growth. Usually after a body of water has been warming up throughout the summer is when we get these blooms. It is most common for the peak of these blooms to be in August."

Cyanobacteria appears like scum, grass clippings, fuzz, or globs on the surface of a given body of water.

Consumption of fish from contaminated water bodies is also advised to be limited. Cooked fish fillets are considered safe to consume, but raw fish and trimmings should be avoided. Local fish can store toxins in their livers.

If physical contact does occur, it is recommended to wash the skin with clean tap water as soon as possible.

"The toxin in the water from cyanobacteria does not get broken down from boiling, and so we recommend not taking water from the lake for consumption. Even if you plan to boil it, that is not sufficiently safe," said Klassen. "The advisory will stay up until it is assessed to be no longer a risk this season. That typically occurs in late fall, early winter ... There is no sufficient way to break down the toxin if people are collecting the water for personal use."

He explained the toxin naturally degrades over time, as well as diffuses into the body of water in question.

Waters of Eagle Lake where cyanobacterial bloom is not visible may still be used for recreational purposes even while the health advisory is in effect.

# County approves resource extraction operation

Wheatland County Municipal Planning Commission approved a development permit application for a natural resource extraction during the Aug. 19 meeting.

County council previously approved the rezoning of five acres of land to Natural Resource Extraction District, Aug. 12, as a prerequisite for the approval of the application.

Approximately 50,000 tons of material, including clay, gravel, and sand are to be taken from the subject lands, located roughly eight kilometers northeast of Dalum.

Currently, the land is very steep. Once it has been reclaimed following the extraction operation, it is to be left as more conducive for effective farming operations.

The top and subsoils are to be replaced, reshaping the hill to allow for safer farming operations and higher gross yields.

The project is anticipated to last between two and four months to see through to completion and will occupy approximately three acres of site area. Extracted materials are planned to be hauled to Drumheller for use to construct flood mitigation berms.

As per county bylaws, landowners within one mile received notice of the application. No responses to the notice were received.

Several conditions were outlined by the county prior to the approval of the project. Among these,

are that the applicant is required to provide documentation confirming the utility owner of the underground gas line adjacent to the borrow pit is amicable to allowing a berm to be placed over the gas line.

Additionally, the applicant is required to provide approval from a geotechnical engineer for the proposed berm identified in their plan. This would include confirmation of the materials used in its construction, and acceptance of the berm plan by the county's third-party engineer.

The applicant is further required to provide an erosion and sediment control plan to show pre-construction, during, and post-construction conditions of the operational site. Prior to the beginning of on-site activities, these will also need to be approved by the county's third-party engineers.

Generally requiring the provision of screening from public roadways, the extraction project has been granted a variance that the berm will only be constructed along the east side of the extraction area.

This variance is conditional upon the approval of the berm construction over the adjacent gas line.

The Municipal Planning commission voted to approve the development permit application with the updated conditions and variances outlined. The application was approved unanimously and will continue pending approvals from the company presiding over the present gas line addressed in the document.

# Measles still a risk

Measles remains one of the most contagious illnesses in the world, spreading through the air when an infected person breathes, coughs or sneezes. In recent months, measles has been spreading in Alberta, across Canada and around the world.

While measles can be serious for anyone, it's especially dangerous during pregnancy. Infection increases the risk of miscarriage, early labor, low birth weight, and even infant death. In rare but devastating cases, the virus passes to the unborn child, causing congenital measles – a serious condition that can lead to lifelong disability or death. Pregnant individuals also face a far greater risk of severe complications, including pneumonia and hospitalization.

So far in 2025, fewer than five babies in Alberta have been diagnosed with congenital measles – all born to mothers who were not immunized. Some required intensive care. There have also been 46 confirmed cases among pregnant individuals, with fewer than five hospitalizations. While the numbers are low, they serve as a stark reminder of what can happen when immunity gaps persist. If you are pregnant and think you may have been exposed to measles, stay home and contact your health care provider, midwife or Health Link at 811 for further guidance.

If you're planning to get pregnant or considering it, ensure you receive two doses of the vaccine at least one month before conception. Although the vaccine isn't given during pregnancy, immune mothers can pass temporary protection to their newborns – a crucial safeguard, since babies under six months are too young to be immunized. In some cases, immune globulin may be offered to exposed pregnant individuals or infants, but it provides only short-term protection. Being immunized before pregnancy provides the best protection from getting infected.

Canada eliminated measles in 1998 through strong routine immunization programs. But outbreaks can still happen. In areas where immunization coverage is low, measles can spread more easily and quietly, making it harder to control.

As children head back to school or start homeschooling, now is the time to check your immunization status as well as that of your children. Whether in classrooms, home-school co-ops, or community programs, children are often in close contact. Even if one child is unprotected, measles can spread rapidly – putting classmates, siblings, and vulnerable individuals at risk.

The good news? Vaccination efforts across Alberta are making a difference. Since March 16, more than 92,000 measles vaccines have been given – a 56 per cent increase over last year. Uptake has risen by 119 per cent in the South Zone and 92 per cent in the North. Early doses for babies aged 6-11 months in high-risk areas have increased by 432 per cent, thanks to targeted outreach.

Since mid-May, Alberta has run a provincewide immunization campaign in more than 14 languages. The message is clear: Don't get measles. Get immunized. With strong uptake continuing, the campaign is being extended and will

include new messaging focused on the back-to-school season and pregnancy.

While weekly case numbers have fluctuated, we're encouraged by the lack of any sustained upward trend. Expanded clinics, focused outreach, and consistent public health messaging are helping to ensure this important information reaches all Albertans and helps to slow the spread.

Still, the work isn't done. Community protection depends on immunization rates of 95 per cent or higher. Getting both doses of the vaccine is a simple but powerful way to protect our homes, schools, and communities.

If you're unsure about your immunization status or that of your children, speak with your doctor or midwife. You can also call Alberta's measles hotline at 1-844-944-3434 to check your records, ask questions and book an appointment.

## County opens discussions regarding rural nursing education program

"The main aim of this program is to reduce nursing shortages in rural areas. By training local residents to become nurses, it ensures they stay and work in the area that they were trained in."

Because of the proximity to Calgary, the selection pool for this program is approximately 100 kilometers from the Drumheller area.

The other two rural Grow Your Own nursing programs are currently based out of Wainwright, which began in 2021 and

is seeing their first set of graduates this year, and Drayton Valley, which will be officially rolled out this fall.

"AHS approached us to fundraise for the creation and retrofitting of the simulation lab at the hospital. The quote ... is to be at a maximum of \$300,000. The simulation lab equipment – about \$60,000 to \$80,000 of equipment, will be provided by the University of Calgary," said Berlando. "AHS will see to the maintenance, repair, and replacement of all the equipment in the lab."

The DAHF is looking to be able to have the required \$300,000 raised by early 2027 in order to move forward with creating the lab and establishing the program.

Berlando suggested to the county the idea of potentially establishing a grant in the realm of \$10,000 and extending the same conversation to municipalities within the 100 km onboarding range.

"This is a really exciting initiative, and I think it is not only creating that opportunity for local residents who are interested in pursuing a healthcare career and removing some of the barriers for that, but the simulation lab will also strengthen rural healthcare through all of the mechanisms outlined," said Reeve Amber Link.

As the Public presentation committee is not able to formalize decisions, they voted to have the matter appear before council at a later meeting.

# Helping youth achieve

Strathmore has welcomed a new initiative aimed at transforming the future of its young people. The Purposeful Youth Network (PUYON International) officially launched Aug. 16, promising mentorship, training, and pathways to meaningful employment for youth across the community.

The organization's founder, Sunday Adeola, said the vision was both spiritual and practical.

"The inspiration behind the creation of Purposeful Youth Network International in Strathmore was first divine. Also, the Purposeful Youth Network International was inspired by a simple truth: our youth in Strathmore have so much potential," he explained. "We created this network because we believe they deserve the mentorship, training and opportunities that will allow them to not just dream, but achieve."

Adeola emphasized that the network was designed to fill a critical gap in the community.

"This network was created to fill a clear gap in our community: the need for structured mentorship, training and pathways to employment for Strathmore's youth," he said. "By addressing this, we are building not just careers, but stronger families and a stronger community."

Among the flagship programs is "Nurturing Futures for Youth," a federally funded initiative under the Youth Employment and Skills Strategy (YESS). The six-week program offers employment skills, life coaching, computer literacy and certifications such as first aid and food safety. Participants earn \$10 per hour, receive completion bonuses and benefit from supports like daycare, healthcare and wage subsidies for future employers.

Adeola noted that success is not only about statistics, but about changed lives.

"Success for me is seeing our young people thrive in meaningful careers, breaking cycles of unemployment and dependency," he said. "The community will see our results not only in the numbers we publish, but in the transformed lives of young people who are now working, thriving and giving back to society."

"Place babies on their backs to sleep for naps and at night". That's excellent advice to new parents to protect their babies from SIDS (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome). Placing the baby on its back is 47 times safer than on their stomachs or sides.

Exercising regularly is an important part of good health. But exercising too close to bedtime can make it harder to fall asleep. Keep your exercising at least four hours before bedtime. It bears repeating other ideas for a better sleep: no alcohol before bedtime; no caffeine-containing drinks or nicotine products 4-6 hours before bed.

There is a myth that using sunscreen will block the skin's ability to produce vitamin D. This is not true. Even with sunscreens, enough sunlight gets through to the skin to allow vitamin D production. Although the links between vitamin D and cancer prevention are inconsistent, there is no doubt that using sunscreen regularly, even on cloudy days, can prevent cancer.

Washing fruits and vegetables before eating is important. This applies to all the melons as well. Melons grow in contact with soil which contain contaminants. Most melons have thick skins to protect the flesh inside but cutting through unwashed skin could possibly contaminate the flesh.




