Strathmore Stampede wraps for 2025

With the Strathmore Stampede now in the rearview mirror, the interim CEO of the Strathmore and District Agricultural Society, Doug Raycroft, commended the organization on another great event.

Despite internal organizational shifts, the Strathmore Stampede saw over 300 volunteers helping out to make sure everything ran as smoothly as possible during the Aug. 1-4 event.

“It was a big learning curve for me for sure with the rodeo part, but the Strathmore Stampede rodeo committee is amazing. They have got some really great guys and a team that is world class. The organization to get this rodeo going ... has been pretty impressive,” said Raycroft. “I stepped in about, I think it was July 3, just interim to kind of – you know, the goal was to try to just help out and get through the rodeo season here as best we can. There is so much to do to get ready for it. It has been fun, and we have been really lucky with the weather here.”

As of Monday, attendance numbers had not yet been calculated, but both mainstage performances were completely sold out - a reflection of the droves of people coming out to be a part of the festivities.

Raycroft added that despite the Sunday morning downpour, the excess water was cleared largely before the Stampede went into full swing for its third day.







Prairie Sky Data Solutions prepares to launch local AI data center

Prairie Sky Data Solutions announced Aug. 2 their intent to begin operations in Strathmore, as they are retrofitting a facility to house an AI-compatible data center.

Stan Swiatek, founder of Prairie Sky Data Solutions, explained the company has been working for the better part of the last year on the groundwork necessary to prepare for officially launching the facility.

"Traditionally, there are just data centers that house data.

The difference between this one is that it is compatible with massive amounts of processing required for AI, and that is what there are very few of. That is what makes it kind of unique," he said. "This allows businesses to be able to access AI. What we are missing here is, the newest technology in order to drive and work AI. That's what this processing centre is."

Swiatek added Alberta is a perfect location for a facility of this type, having easy and regular access to the tremendous amounts of electricity required to power their operations.

He favours Strathmore, having been a part of the local business community for the last seven years, as well as local infrastructure providing an ideal environment.

"In doing this over the last year, plus, we required municipal support. We brought the project to them; there has been a lot of research, and assistance from them, and what is involved. It does bring quite a bit of revenue and taxation to the town," said Swiatek. "The initial power source should have us operational before June of next year. We will be adding to it in order for expanding that we are anticipating. There are a lot of hoops to jump through in doing that and

getting additional power to the source we already have."

Angela Groeneveld, senior manager of economic development with the Town of Strathmore, explained the repurposed facility was formerly utilized as a cannabis manufacturing plant.

The eventual idea is to expand from the one building currently being retrofitted into all of the remnants from Swiatek's previous company.

"They are trying to do as much local procurement as they can, and they have been a great partner to work with the town, because they have been at the table with their CEO quite a bit talking about how they can give back to the community," said Groeneveld. "The announcement is just a teaser, just a coming soon - so as the applications are coming in, I know that they have already secured clients and workforce, and equipment. They will be doing a big celebration in the community in Q3, in the fall, in Strathmore, and that is where they will be doing the formal announcement."



"There are so many moving parts ... there are just so many people who work together and it all came together. We had some real challenges with the weather the week before. I know our rodeo committee, they did a lot of work to get the water out of here last week and to get the track ready," he said. "During the week, even preparing it, there was a lot of rain too, so just a lot of work and to see the weather just break apart at the right time and let us have a successful weekend has been amazing."

Though Saturday's Running with the Bulls was met with discontent for the lack of action and excitement, Sunday's run garnered much more crowd engagement and satisfaction.

Raycroft said safety for all those in attendance was a primary concern from the committee.

"It is a real balancing act. Everybody wants to see interaction with those bulls, so I think the big thing was just trying to keep only the people that needed to be in there so that if we needed to step in and give medical attention to someone, we were quick to be there," he explained. "Every year you tweak a few little things to make sure it runs well."

Glass outraces Vigen to win Strathmore Stampede title

Jason Glass accomplished a hat trick of sorts in Strathmore on Monday, Aug. 4.

By winning the \$30,000 Championship Final Heat aboard his Birchcliff Energy Ltd. chuckwagon, Glass added a third Strathmore Stampede title to the ones he won in back-to-back years in 2014-15.

"I love this town," said Glass, who made the short trip up to Strathmore from his home in High River. "The crowd seems to like the checkered wagon. They're always loud when we come across the finish line and they're very appreciative after the race, so it's always fun in Strathmore."

"It's not far from my hometown, so I know I've got some friends and family in the stands and I think this committee in this town, they put on a hell of a weekend and hopefully we come back here for a long time."

Although he finished second behind Chansé Vigen's Blackstone Drilling Fluids Ltd. outfit in the three-night aggregate standings (from times recorded Friday through Sunday), Glass earned a measure of revenge by beating his rival across the finish line during Monday's 'Dash For Cash.'

"Vigen's on fire," said Glass, who recorded Monday's fastest time of 1:13.94 to edge Vigen by just 91/100ths of a second. "He's been flying for several years now and driving amazing. He's got some really talented horses that can really fly out there and I love that."

Glass also credited his own amazing equine athletes for their spectacular efforts during the four-day show.

"I've been driving quite a few new ones the last few shows," said Glass, who's sitting in first place in the World Professional Chuckwagon Association driver standings with 992 points - which is just 21.5 ahead of Vigen and 23.5 ahead of Evan Salmond. "I'm very proud of them. Just beautiful horses. We shuffle them around a lot and try to keep them fresh. To outrun some of these other drivers you need to be on top of your game and those horses need to love what they do."

The veteran 54-year-old reinsman also praised the jobs that his outriders Tyson Whitehead and Trey MacGillivray did to

help him win the title.

"Tyson Whitehead, he's been riding for me for several years," Glass said. "He's an amazing, talented athlete and does a great job, and Trey MacGillivray has also been riding for me most of the summer and doing a great job as well, so hats off to those guys. They're great cowboys."

For his efforts, Glass won \$15,000, while Vigen pocketed \$7,500. Salmond took home \$4,500 for finishing third in the final, while Lane Tournier (driving for his injured father Luke Tournier) earned \$3,000 after crossing the finish line in fourth spot.

The championship finalists had the four fastest times from Monday's nine races, while Jamie Laboucane's clocking of 1:15.44 to win the third heat was good enough for fifth spot on the afternoon.

After the conclusion of the Strathmore Stampede, the contingent of WPCA Pro Tour drivers quickly packed up to make the long trek to Dawson Creek, B.C., for the Battle of the North, which runs from Wednesday to Sunday.

People with restless legs syndrome (RLS) experience an overwhelming need to move their legs, particularly at night or as they fall asleep. Although the exact cause is unclear, one suggestion is that iron deficiency might be contributing to the problem. This is something to consider when talking with your doctor.

Over the past 15 years, there has been a fourfold increase in adult syphilis rates in Canada. There has also been a threefold increase in congenital cases through mother-to-child transmission. Prevention of syphilis continues to emphasize using condoms during high-risk sexual activity. Infection begins with a hard, painless sore on the genitals, followed by flu-like symptoms, and body rash. Seek medical advice.

Many people are addicted to their screens and spend hours per day scrolling. It is a waste of time and not healthy. Try to gradually reduce your average time online. Limit your social media use to a specific period each day or even just weekends. Try having one social media-free day per week. And turn off your notifications to prevent unsolicited distractions.

New for 2025 – Wheatland County Voter Registration

As of 2025, Wheatland County is required to maintain a Permanent Electors Register under the *Municipal Affairs Statutes Amendment Act*.

Voter information will be securely shared between Elections Alberta and Wheatland County, as outlined in the *Local Authorities Election Act (LAEA) section 49*, to help verify voter identity during municipal elections.

- To vote, you must be registered. Voter cards will no longer be mailed—you'll confirm your eligibility by signing the elector register at the polls.
- Register, update, or check your info at voterlink.ab.ca before September 2025.



“Taffinel LeBlanc is the best booking agent. The contracts were well-written,



Durazo wins third bull-riding title in Strathmore

Edgar Durazo has found a home away from home at the Strathmore Stampede.

Originally from Moctezuma, Sonora, Mexico, Durazo now resides with his wife Karla and their three children in the community surrounding Speargrass Golf Course.

The talented bull rider made the short 15-minute drive north on Monday to pick up his 2025 Strathmore Stampede rodeo championship buckle to add to his growing collection.

He also won the bull-riding competition in Strathmore in 2021 and 2023 in addition to having a second-place showing sandwiched between those two victories.

"I'm local, so I have to do good," said Durazo of his motivation to perform on such a high level in front of his enthusiastic fans at the Strathmore Stampede Grounds.

On Saturday afternoon, Durazo set a strong standard by virtue of his thrilling 87.75-point performance atop Santana.

"There was a lot of people here," said Durazo, who could feel the support of the crowd during his wild ride. "It was pretty electric. It was loud. It was awesome – beautiful feeling."

Durazo then returned to Strathmore on Monday to watch the final go-round of the competition to see if any of the final 10 bull riders could beat his score.

As the last competitor out of the chutes, Jacob Gardner of Fort St. John, B.C., lasted the requisite eight seconds atop Wreckonced, but had to settle for second place after the judges awarded him 86 points.

"I know the bull that he had and he was pretty good and he (could) win on him," Durazo said. "I was cheering for him."

Durazo's first-place showing earned him a payday of \$7,159.04, while Gardner had to settle for winning \$5,880.64 for finishing second.

Meanwhile, Quinten Taylor of Parkland, Alta., won his first saddle-bronc title in Strathmore by virtue of his 88.25-point ride aboard Copy Cat on

Monday afternoon.

"This rodeo is only an hour away from where I grew up and where my mom and dad lived, so it's kind of like a hometown deal," said Taylor, who took home \$6,925.92 for his efforts. "It's a pretty cool feeling."

Following his ride, Taylor had a good feeling that the judges would reward him with a spectacular score.

"I saw a couple videos of him and had a game plan for today," said Taylor, who did his advance homework on Copy Cat. "He went out there, had some moves and bucked and he was everything you could have wanted in a bucking horse."

Cole Franks of Clarendon, Texas, also had a sneaking suspicion that he could win his first bareback championship in Strathmore when he saw that he was going up against Ols Tubs Stevie Knicks on Monday.

"Today was the third time I've been on that horse, so I had an idea of what to expect, how it was going to feel, kind of what I had to do," said Franks, whose score of 90.75 points earned him a first-place cheque worth \$6,519.84. "I'm not going to lie, she kind of surprised me a little bit. It was a little bit different than I was expecting. Still, it was so much fun. She's so electric, always. She's trying to get you off her back as hard as she can and you've just got to aim low on her and keep doing your job. It's hard, but so much fun."
