## Water restrictions return

Strathmore has implemented Stage 4 water restrictions in response to a water main break in Calgary.

Becoming effective Dec. 31, the restrictions prohibit outdoor water use such as flooding outdoor ice surfaces, however, indoor facilities such as pools, ice rinks, and recreation facilities are remaining open.

“The Town of Strathmore gets its water directly from Calgary. We are customers of the water supply from Calgary and there is a below-ground water line that delivers water directly from Calgary to us,” said Mayor Pat Fule.

“The basic history of it is that in the eighties and nineties, we had our own water reservoir that was fed from the Western Irrigation District (WID) canal and we had our own water treatment plant ... Strathmore had run into a situation where it was having a problem facing future growth because the reservoir and treatment plant weren't big enough and the treatment plant wasn't as advanced as it needed to be.”

The current water infrastructure in town allows for several days of water to be stored in case of shortage or emergency and is currently being discussed amongst council to be expanded upon.

The town has refrained from tapping into aquifers and treating its own water due to cost concerns associated with establishing such infrastructure. This would have to be downloaded onto local taxpayers, increasing local taxes beyond what council is comfortable doing.

Under the Stage 4 restrictions, the town is asking residents to consider several steps to limit their household water consumption.

These actions include limiting showers to under three minutes, flushing toilets only when necessary, and running dish-washers only when full.

# Lakewood of Strathmore looks forward into 2026

The Lakewood of Strathmore team is excited to boast their most successful year to date in terms of the number of new lots coming available.

According to Scott Silva, director of sales and marketing, Lakewood of Strathmore had over 100 new lots readied in Phase 2B of the ongoing development.

“Our home sales are still steady even though the market has had some fluctuations. We have actually broken several million-dollar custom homes that are walk out on the water. One of them is even on the new recreational canal that feeds into the recreational lake,” said Silva. “Lakewood of Strathmore Developments, we are not a large group. We are a small group, very hands on, and that is a big testament to ... our entire team – all of our consultants, all of our part-

ners, contractors – it is an amazing machine.”

Silva also highlighted the \$76,000 donation which was able to be made to the Strathmore Overnight Shelter being one of the larger ways the team has been able to give back to the local community this year.

Another recent event held earlier in December was able to raise approximately 550 pounds of donated food for the Wheatland County Food Bank.

“We are really proud of the team, and everybody, and this entire community. Not only Lakewood, but the Town of Strathmore. This is an amazing town with amazing people and as we grow, I just hope that remains a staple for this community,” said Silva. “When it comes down to the business side of things, some of the big highlights were home types alongside home sales. We have the first under drive garage homes built ... under drive is where the garage is effectively

in the basement, you can drive right into the garage, and your house is above it.”

At this point in the community’s development, Silva reported that several homes have now been both constructed and sold beyond the million-dollar threshold.

Going into 2026, the groundwork is being established for detached garage homes as well as duplexes to be able to come online and be available to the public.

“2026 is really amazing because you are going to see progress on the lake like you have never seen before. Anybody in Hillview can tell you when you look down at Lakewood now, it looks nothing like it did a year ago,” said Silva. “Next year, it is going to be the exact same thing. The lake is now taking shape – it has been underway and next spring we are going to start again on it, and it will continue its evolution, so that by 2027 you are going to see Strathmore’s very own first and only recreational lake.”

# Wheatland Kings to serve at Boston Pizza as a team fundraiser

Switching from jerseys to aprons, the Agra Risk Wheatland Kings will be working the floor of Strathmore’s Boston Pizza to raise money for the organization later this month.

Cody Holdaway, the team’s general manager, explained the family restaurant has been a longtime supporter of the Kings and they are proud to be working together on this idea.

“I think it is actually going to be fun not only for the fans, but for our players. On Jan. 25, there are two seating times, but our players will essentially be the servers, so they will be the staff taking care of you that night,” he said. “It’s the first time our organization has ever done a midseason fundraiser like this, but it has definitely been done by other teams in other leagues and around the junior hockey scene for sure. It’s actually a pretty popular fundraiser among other

teams and I figured it was just a good way to raise some more money for the club ahead of what is anticipated to be a pretty big playoff run.”

Holdaway said after pitching the idea to Boston Pizza, their team did not hesitate to jump on board.

The idea being to create a new opportunity for fans and families to meet and connect with the players in an environment outside of the arena, as well as to support ongoing operations.

“Running a junior hockey team, it is expensive, and as I’m sure everyone knows, the cost of things isn’t going down. Just like everyone else’s family, everything we do at the rink and outside the rink is getting more expensive too,” said Holdaway. “The more money that we can put in the team bank ac-

count is always better. It’s going to help get our bus down the road for months and years to go.”

Holdaway suggested 10 per cent of proceeds from the event would go towards the team.

The players, he added, continue their pattern this season of being particularly eager to jump on board when it comes to participation throughout the local community.

“When I pitched it to my leadership group, they were actually pretty excited. I think it is going to be fun for the players as well to connect with the people (who) support this team on a deeper, more personal level,” he said. “When the players are down at ice level in full gear, playing hockey, they don’t get to talk to the people who come to every home game and support the team. I think it is going to be good for them as well.”

Though not confirmed, Holdaway said he would be on board with seeing this becoming an annual event for the Kings to participate in.

The two seating times being made available are from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. and from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. on the day of the fundraiser. Seating may be reserved at Boston Pizza ahead of time, as both organizations are anticipating the restaurant to fill quickly.

# All-female tournament takes over county

The Wheatland Wranglers debuted their new all-female hockey tournament throughout the county over the course of the weekend.

U9 through U18 teams from across Alberta, as well as some from British Columbia – 33 in all, came out to compete. Kristie Stoodley, tournament coordinator, said there were approximately 570 athletes in attendance.

The tournament took over the ice of both rinks in Strathmore at the Family Center Arena, as well as in Standard and Gleichen.

“We had to stay on a strict time schedule at each rink. Everything was kind of timed to a T, with the floods and the game timing – everything had to run lickety-split so we didn’t get behind schedule,” said Stoodley. “It (was) a big job, it’s been a lot. This is Krista (Thurston) and I’s first year as well running and organizing a tournament. It’s been a learning curve for us, but I feel like we are just trucking along as we go, doing our best.”

The idea to host a tournament of this scale stem-

med from a desire to host the entire Wranglers organization in one event over a single weekend.

Participating teams ran through a round-robin format, playing four games before the top contenders went on to the playoff rounds. The U9 division held only the round robin games.

The Wranglers U7 team played an exhibition game as a showcase in order to also have them included.

“We’ve got some sponsors that have sponsored our MVP prize ... we have got a lot of cash sponsors and local sponsors in the communities that have been really great to help us with raffle donations and with cash to help the tournament function,” added Stoodley. “It’s (also) brought a lot of revenue into the town for sure. Our hotels have worked with us and given us some room blocks to hand out to some teams. We also have teams in hotels on the east side of Calgary. With this many people, it’s hard to fit everybody in our town.”

Going forward, the Wranglers organization is not opposed to hosting events of a similar scale in future years.

Fule added there is currently no exact estimate on how long

the town will be subject to the ongoing water use restrictions.

“People might want to watch their local news ... they might also want to check the City of Calgary website. Our administration and staff does hear from the City of Calgary, but I would be really reticent as far as making a prediction or saying when they hope that it will be fixed,” he said. “My hope is that they were prepared and that this time, they have all the equipment ready, they have got materials ready and they have, from what I understand, identified where the break happened.”

Expenses that the Town of Strathmore must expend in order to maintain services, emergency shelters, or extra work that must be completed is to be monitored and reimbursed by the City of Calgary and the Province of Alberta.

Early mornings in the freezing winter and extended periods of time away from his family in the summer during peak work periods, his sole objective was to provide. His mantra to his children growing up was, "We are poor in cash but rich in love" reinforcing the essentials of life. He did it his way. The song and dance that was in his blood continues to flow in the family members that followed.

Food in the family always represented love and while in this small rural village in Alberta, he would open up his household every fall to welcome the community to share in the Filipino culture of roast pig (lechon) and hospitality. Part of that legacy was the generational gift of ice hockey. He worked overtime in the summer months to ensure that his sons would be able to afford the sport, continuing on the gift to his grandsons. Education was his sole purpose for choosing the difficult path of immigration to Canada. His promise to his wife was, "We are not coming to Canada to become rich. Our purpose is to educate all the children so that they don't have to be poor like the past generations".

After the completion of post-secondary education of all his children, he expressed to his wife that his purpose was complete. It was not only complete but expanded upon. The academic achievement continued not only through his children, but also through the diligence and hard work of all his grandchildren. He navigated life with a loving intention so evident with his gentle kindness and mischievous humour. A care and love that was expressed to his surviving wife and children until the moment that God embraced him to come home.

A Funeral Mass was held on Saturday, January 3, 2026, at 11:00 am at Holy Trinity Catholic Church (1525 45 St SE, Calgary, AB) with a Viewing held prior at 10:00 am.




